Tips for Holding Bealtaine Events

- Involve as many people and groups in the planning of the event such as local clubs, sports or community centres, primary and secondary schools, the local library and local businesses.
- Think of the environmental impact of your event. Contact the Councils Environmental Awareness Officer Sinéad Ní Mhainnin on 091 509566 to get advise on 'Greening' your event.
- Try to promote the event as much as possible for example by using posters, flyers, church newsletter, local media, social media and so on.
