In connection with the Aedhridheacht it is proposed also to hold a tugo'-war tournament, for which the following teams have entered :- Ballymacward, Garbally (Skehanagh), Gurteen, Springlawn (Moylough), Kiltulla, and Newcastle. Prizes to school children of the parish will also be distributed. Tickets for admission to the field can be had at the modest rate of 4d. An enjoyable ceilidh will be held in th evening. The proposed event has attracted a good deal of attention and interest locally, and the members of the Committee are leaving nothing undone to make the day a great success.
