My dear Mother

After a lapse of a few years, I think it is nigh time I again dropped you a few lines. I know you will forgive me. Dear, I have no excuse to offer but neglect, however, I often hear that you are well & able to go to Mass. I am well aware that you would have to be very bad if you could not attend to that. You will reap your heavenly reward hereafter. If you do not, then God help us all. You will be pleased to know that I am fairly well in health at present only sometimes I get an attack of rheumatics something similar to your own complaint but not quite so bad. I had a letter from Brother Patt lately. He is in the best of health he tells me of course as you are aware he has been removed away from his wife & family to a back country station when I say that I mean that it would not suit him to take his boy & girl away from their education as I am informed he is sparing no money ...
