Conny told a good few doctors in dublin about me & i got medicin from thur & don no good.

one of the nurses was telling her that her own father was the verry same way & that he tryed all the doctors in dublin & don him know good & it clared away at finnish.

If i get a little more courage myself & your mother will go to galway the next month. you know in lodging

houses they dont want anny one
that is sickley or complaining + marys
is two far of so if we dont go it is

lovelly childerin i think there will be

In this country they only have five week
holidays Nora + the sligoes are fine also

bother with annything only hard work
We had wonderful heat last week but
we have a change we had plenty of thund
er + rain for the last few days
