Grammar and Geography, (2) The pupils shd be encouraged to give individual connected oral acct. in their own words of Reading lessons. This will have a beneficial effect on oral English generally, as well as on the written compositions.

4. The time-table needs revision. At present 2 prep. & 2 slate exercises lessons. MENTAL AND THEORY. Div. go on simultaneously. Why not arrange it so that one prep. shd be at oral work & the other at suitable desk work. Give another half hour to history. It would be advisable to begin the Arith lessons with mental questions, the pupils stating the methods of reason for working the question.

5. ARITHMETIC. The boys are intelligent and the proficiency is generally good. Oral comp & conversation lessons should be practised more freely in the junior shd as to accuracy, the pupils to express themselves readily. Reading is fluent and (are making progress in giving connected account of lessons read.

6. GRAMMAR. Try to get more taste and expression into the recitation of poetry. 7. Some Group st. 344 at Geography & teach as suggested.

8. GENERAL OBSERVATIONS, as to Discipline, Cleanliness, Repairs of House, School Accounts. 9. The infants require training in the proper method of sitting at desks and also of holding pens. In fact all classes would benefit from this training.

10. I was pleased with the drill especially that of the Seniors. 11. A leave of absence book should be kept. Infants and first may be entered separately in Report Book. The accounts are correct.
