Very few phone boxes are still around. Most people have mobile phones now.

Houses and buildings were thatched before slates and tiles were used. Some cottages today still have thatched roofs and thatching is a very specialized craft. Do you see any thatched cottages?

Ringforts are circular enclosures or farmsteads where animals and families were kept safe. They generally date from 500AD. Find a place name/sign with Rath, Lios, Dun or Caher in it!

Round Towers were built from the C10th - C12th and associated with monasteries. The bell could be heard for miles around calling people to prayer.

Tower houses are three or four storey rectangular stone castles. They date from C15th to C17th. The living quarters were upstairs. A murder hole over the front entrance deterred unwanted guests!
