'Woman of the Knee' wins heritage award for Emma

A SKEHANA woman has been announced as the 2022 by the National Heritage Council for her project An Bhean Ghlúine, which showcases the courageous work of midwives during the early 20th century.

Emma Laffey, a local historian and member of Skehana and District Heritage Group, spent hundreds of hours gathering interviews, photographs, documents and old video footage, which culminated in the successful An the Knee.
